LAYERING OF SKILLS

VOCABULARY - Evaluates all individual visual responsibilities of the winds, percussion, and auxiliaries. Consideration is given to the variety of individual skills presented, giving credit to the range and complexity of movement and choreography of all performing members, and how this contributes to the collective visual vocabulary. Consideration is given for simultaneous responsibilities that exist with an emphasis on the visual.

CONTROL -Evaluates the uniform application of all visual responsibilities displayed by all individuals, including the auxiliaries, through time and space. Consideration is also given to the uniformity in applying movement techniques and specific visual articulations.

VOCABULARY COMPLEXITY OF SKILLS

LAYERING OF SKILLS

APPRENTICE 0 - 24.9

The demonstrated skills are limited and lack definition. Demonstration of basic skills is inconsistent and more specific training is needed to enable the individuals to receive credit. Very little layering of skills is inherent in the visual presentation.

PROFICIENT **25.0** - 34.9

An average variety of somewhat defined skills are required by the performers, with the moderate complexity of those skills required. There may be some moderate layering of responsibilities at this level. Sporadic advance skills mav appear but have clarity issues.

SUPERIOR 35.0 - 42.4

A wide variety of defined skills are required of most of the performers. Simultaneous responsibilities add depth and range to the vocabulary. Frequent complexity of skills is advanced and the lavering of skills inherent in the program is advanced as well.

DISTINGUISHED 42.5 - 50.0

Elements of creativity are apparent throughout the skill sets asked of the performers. A variety of advanced demands are placed on the performers. Complexity and the layering of skills inherent in the program are advanced consistently throughout the presentation.

CONTROL UNIFORMITY TECHNIQUE POSTURE/CARRIAGE TIME/SPACE ARTICULATIONS

APPRENTICE 0 - 24.9

Performers display a below average level of achievement in accuracy. There is a lack of uniformity in the display of technique, posture and carriage. Visual articulations are inconsistent and the projection of style is below average. Recovery from mistakes are seldom professional.

PROFICIENT 25.0 - 34.9

Performers display an average individual skill level in technique and accuracy. Posture and carriage are somewhat defined. Attempts at projection of style are evident. Time and space articulations are somewhat consistent. Average recoveries are made, but delays may be observed.

SUPERIOR 35.0 - 42.4

Performers display an above average individual skill level in technique and accuracy. There is above average carriage and posture most of the time. Individual style projection is observed frequently. Minor flaws in time and space articulations occur, but recovery is mostly rapid.

DISTINGUISHED 42.5 - 50.0

Performers demonstrate a high level of achievement in uniformity. Posture, carriage, intervals, alignments and all visual articulations (time/space) are consistently uniform. Style projection is at a consistently high level and recoveries are immediate from the few flaws that may occur.
